



## Pattern Collection: Accessories



### **Choux Cowl**

### **SIZES**

One Size

### **FINISHED MEASUREMENTS**

**Circumference:** 50"

**Width:** 12½" (25" total circumference)

### **MATERIALS**

**Rozetti Yarns Alaska** (44% acrylic, 26% polyamide, 15% alpaca, 15% superwash fine merino wool; 50g/246 yds)

- 906 Buff (MC) – 2 balls
- 901 Icicle (CC) – 2 balls

**Needles:** US Size 6 (4 mm) 24" circular *or size needed to obtain gauge*

**Notions:** Tapestry needle, stitch marker, for seamless version only: spare 24" circ ndl, US Size 7 (4.5 mm) crochet hook, waste yarn

### **GAUGE**

20 sts x 32 rows = 4" in Plaid pattern

**Save time, check your gauge.**

*Knit. Relax. Smile. Repeat!*

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## PATTERN NOTES

This perfectly plaid cowl is plush, soft, and perfect to keep you warm on brisk days. Knit in Alaska, this reversible cowl feels so lightweight and luxurious you'll never want to take it off.

The Choux Cowl is knit as a tube in the round. There are two options for finishing. First, you can simply sew the ends of the tube together for a fast, simple finish. If you prefer a more professional, seamless look, we recommend using a crochet provisional cast-on and grafting the ends of the tubes together.

### Crochet Provisional Cast-on

With waste yarn and crochet hook, make a ch approximately 10 chs longer than the number of sts to be cast on. With working yarn and knitting needle, pick up and knit sts through the bottom bump of each ch.

## STITCH GUIDE

### Plaid Pattern

(multiple of 4 sts)

**Odd Rnds 1-7:** With MC, knit to end.

**Even Rnds 2-6:** With CC, \* k3, sl 1 pwise wyib; rep from \* to end.

**Rnd 8:** With MC, knit to end.

Rep Rnds 1-8 for patt.

## COWL

With MC, cast on 124 sts (see pattern notes). PM and join to knit in the rnd, being careful not to twist sts.

Work Rnds 1-8 of Plaid patt. Patt will be repeated 31 times each rnd. Cont as est'd until piece meas approx 50", ending with Rnd 6 of patt.

### Seamed Version

With MC, bind off all sts.

### Seamless Version

Carefully unravel the waste yarn from the cast-on edge and place live sts onto a spare circ ndl. Bring both ends of the tube parallel to one another, taking care not to twist the tube. With RS facing and MC, graft the 2 sets of sts tog using Kitchener

stitch. Take care to ensure the WS's of each end are facing inward when grafting.

## FINISHING

### Seamed Version

Sew cast-on and bind-off edges together.


### Both Versions

Block to finished measurements and weave in ends.
