FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Height: 2"

Foot Length: 3½"

MATERIALS

Universal Yarn Mystical Marl (50% antipilling acrylic, 50% cotton; 50g/109 yds)

• 102 Hibiscus – 1 ball

Needles: US Size 7 (4.5 mm) straight or

size needed to obtain gauge

Notions: Tapestry needle, US Size G/6 (4

mm) crochet hook (for ties)

GAUGE

18 sts x 28 rows = 4" in Stockinette stitch

(St st)

Save time, check your gauge.



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PATTERN NOTES

Cute and cozy, the Tiny Treads booties are perfect for your little one. Our soft, colorful Mystical Marl yarn is an excellent choice for baby projects thanks to its easy-care blend of antipilling acrylic and cotton. This simple pattern works up incredibly fast, and one ball will make many booties – perfect for knitting a pair for all the itty-bitties in your life.

These booties are knit flat. First, the entire length of the foot is created with the cast-on. After the depth of the upper foot is reached, stitches are bound off on each side to create a "T" shape, and the center stitches are continued to create the sole. Then, the piece is folded and sewn together to create the bootie. Finally, a crochet chain is used to create ties for the booties. An illustration is included to demonstrate where seams are joined.



BOOTIE

(make two alike)

Cast on 33 sts, leaving approx. 14" tail for sewing.

Row 1 (WS): Knit. Row 2 (RS): Knit.

Row 3: Knit. Row 4: Knit.

Row 5: K1. purl to last st. k1.

Row 6: Knit.

Rows 7-12: Rep Rows 5-6, 3 more times – piece meas approx. 1%" from cast-on edge.

Rows 13-14: Knit.

Row 15: Bind off 11, purl to last st, k1 - 22 sts rem.

Row 16: Bind off 11, knit to end - 11 sts rem.

Row 17: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Row 18: Knit.

Rows 19-32: Rep Rows 17-18, 7 more times.

Next Row: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Bind off all sts, leaving a tail of approx. 14" for

sewing.

FINISHING

Right Bootie

Using the Right Bootie illustration as a guide, with RS facing, join seams in order using mattress stitch. Note that Seam 3 will overlap Seam 1. Seams 1 and 3 create the Toe. Seams 2 and 4 create the side of the foot. Use the tails from the cast-on and bind-off edge to create these seams, if desired.



Left Bootie

Using the Left Bootie illustration as a guide, with RS facing, join seams in order using mattress stitch. Note that Seam 3 will overlap Seam 1. Seams 1 and 3 create the Toe. Seams 2 and 4 create the side of the foot. Use the tails from the cast-on and bind-off edge to create these seams, if desired.

Ties

With a crochet hook, make a chain approx. 10-11" long. Fasten off. Using a tapestry needle, thread the chain through the fabric at the beginning of the overlap on the top of the foot, taking care to ensure you thread through both layers. Weave ends into the chain. Tie a small overhand knot on each end. Tie together into a bow. Rep for opposite Bootie.




